## **Good News**

#### Your Parish Council have just won an award

The Local Council Award Scheme (LCAS) has been designed to celebrate the successes of the very best local councils and to provide a framework to support all local councils to improve and develop to meet their full potential. The



scheme offers councils the opportunity to show that they meet the standards set by the sector, assessed them by their peers, and put in place the conditions for continued improvement. Parish Councils from around the country can apply for the award, and we now join a group of only 4 other Parish Councils in Cheshire East to receive the Foundation Award. Thanks to Chris, Selina and Nigel for their hard work.

#### Who are we, what do we do?

We are a small Parish with about 184 properties and 420 electors. We have 10 non-political Councillors from all round the Parish. Being a Councillor is a voluntary position which includes varying amounts of work not just meetings. You see Councillors litter picking, cleaning signs, planting bulbs and even painting finger posts.

Parish Council meetings are bi-monthly, generally public and you are welcome to attend but we would ask

that you contact the Clerk so chairs are available. Meetings are formal but friendly. The agenda and minutes are posted on the Parish website and Village noticeboards so you can always check what is going on. Planning is probably the most discussed topic and we have a number of Councillors with experience and training. Unfortunately, we don't have as much power as we would like as Cheshire East Planning Department makes most of the decisions. Councillors know about relevant history, drainage, wildlife, roads, power and local issues, as well as our Neighbourhood Plan, in order to keep things appropriate and protect the local environment.

Most Parish Council funding comes from a small precept (fee) contained within council tax. This money pays for our invaluable part-time Clerk, website, improvements, notice boards and a street light at the Boar's Head junction. Full details can be found on the Parish website which we are legally obliged to keep up to date. The Council obtained some other funding and formed an Improvement Committee which includes residents. We have suggestions to fund village benches, a wildflower verge, some trees and a defibrillator. If you can think of anything you think would improve the Parish - please let us know.



Cheshire East is holding a 12-week consultation on proposals for the governance arrangements for town and parish councils in the borough. This consultation closes on the 28<sup>th</sup> November 2021 and your Parish Council would like to know your views and send them in to Cheshire East. The draft recommendations affecting our Parish Council would be to reduce the number of Parish Councillors from 10 to 7.

The Parish Council oppose this recommendation, as it reduces the democratic process, makes sharing the workload more difficult and makes effective contacts with residents much more difficult in our widespread rural community. Councillors are volunteers so there are no cost implications. Please let us know your views by November 20<sup>th</sup> via our website link, or by emailing <u>Parish.Clerk@handwpc.org.uk</u>. #### Parish Website Now Accessible

Work has recently been completed on a major revamp of the parish website. Changes in government requirements and in the web design facilities available from our hosting service meant that getting the website up-to-date was a lot of work. In conjunction with Chris Knibbs and Selina Clarke, Nigel Dibben has written a new site designed with accessibility in mind, a legal requirement for the Parish Council: <u>https://www.handwpc.org.uk/</u>. The new site contains a lot

more information about the parish and also provides access to current and past documents such as council meeting minutes and financial reports. There are also sections listing planning applications going back to the year dot as well as some history and local stories.

**Keep in Touch**. The Website has a page allowing residents to subscribe to the email list for news that the Parish Clerk sends out from time to time, so please sign up. We don't send adverts or pass on your addresses, but if there alerts, break-ins etc, we can let you know as soon as we know.

or you can let Nigel know via highways@handwpc.org.uk he will make the report to Cheshire East Highways for you, and he adds it to our Parish Council problem reporting system where regular chasing can take place.

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Cheshire East have purchased, with Government funding, three very smart mini buses. Two in service and one as a spare to accommodate servicing or breakdowns. This came on stream on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October for a 3 year trial.

The concept is to allow users to either download the app. and book direct or phone in to make a booking up to a fortnight in advance. The service will pick you up from the nearest bus stop to your location or possibly close to your house if in a remote location. No timetable, no fixed routes, it's flexible. The fare is fixed at £3 for travel within the local map area (£2 for concessions) and covers the rural area from Buerton to Bunbury, Audlem, Hatherton to Nantwich and many villages in between, but not Crewe or Walgherton.

It runs from 7am to 9pm Monday to Saturday. If you want a return service, you must book a separate return trip.

It's a new concept in rural service transport provision and is an opportunity for the area. If it works it will undoubtedly be taken up in other rural areas so give it a try. At some point traffic lights will be installed at this junction to ease traffic flow. 
